## DISCUSS

Read Matthew 7:1-12

#### Listening to Jesus

As you reflect on our worship gathering this week, what is the primary message of truth you sensed God speaking to you?

#### The Golden Rule

Pastor John challenged us to do 2 things in every interaction we have this week:

- 1. Ask yourself: How would I want to be treated in this situation if I were in their shoes?
- 2. Ask God: Lord, will you help me?
- Even though many of us learn from a young age that we are to treat others as we want to be treated, why is it so difficult to remember?
- What is something you can do to help you remember John's challenge to try to apply the Golden Rule to all your interactions this week?

#### Love Instead of Judge

- What do we need to believe about God, ourselves, and others to be able to love instead of judge?
- When was a time God took your natural reaction to judge and transformed it into love?
- When was a time someone demonstrated love to you by using discernment to restore you rather than judgment?

#### Neither Do I (scripture at right in blue)

Read John 8:2-11

- Who all was being judged in this story?
- How does Jesus flip the script?
- What role does humility play in this story?
- What do we learn about Jesus from this story?
- How can you follow Jesus' example from this story in your own life?

<sup>2</sup> At dawn he appeared again in the temple courts, where all the people gathered around him, and he sat down to teach them. <sup>3</sup> The teachers of the law and the Pharisees brought in a woman caught in adultery. They made her stand before the group <sup>4</sup> and said to Jesus, "Teacher, this woman was caught in the act of adultery. <sup>5</sup> In the Law Moses commanded us to stone such women. Now what do you say?" <sup>6</sup> They were using this question as a trap, in order to have a basis for accusing him.

But Jesus bent down and started to write on the ground with his finger. When they kept on questioning him, he straightened up and said to them, "Let any one of you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." Again he stooped down and wrote on the ground.

<sup>9</sup>At this, those who heard began to go away one at a time, the older ones first, until only Jesus was left, with the woman still standing there. <sup>10</sup> Jesus straightened up and asked her, "Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?"

<sup>11</sup> "No one, sir," she said.

"Then neither do I condemn you," Jesus declared.
"Go now and leave your life of sin."
